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HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

G

GET STARTED

We suggest reading through the entire book you are going to study for the next 5 weeks. It will help you gain context and background. Visit us at <https://thecruciblesfire.org/bible-reading-plans> for reading plans tailored to this method.

S

SUPPLIES

Bible, pen, a highlighter, these printouts. We strongly encourage you to use an actual Bible. This tactile feel can help you remember what you study.

F

FOCUS

Use this time to focus your mind, your spirit, and your emotions through prayer, worship, or both.

T

TEXT

Use this space each day to write out word for word the five verses for that day.

O

OBSERVE

Record what you actually observe in the text. Be sure to see all that is there, being careful to avoid seeing things that aren't.



HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

G

INTERPRET

This is where you will dig deeper in the passage to figure out what your observations actually MEAN. See the Vocabulary Helps section for more information regarding how to dig deeper into the meaning of what you find. See the Interpretation Help section.

S

APPLY

Once you have a grasp on the meaning, it is time to apply the Truths to your life. The purpose of scripture study, after all, is to mold us into the image of Christ!

F

REFLECT

Use this space to ponder and meditate on the truths you've learned in your study. What have you learned about God, yourself, and your walk with God?

T

PRAY

Always end your time with God in prayer, thanking Him for what you've learned and asking for continued blessing from His Word.



HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE



OBSERVATION HELP

What did you OBSERVE in this text?

Who:

Find out who the passage was written to, who wrote it, and who is mentioned in the passage itself.

What:

Determine the main idea of the passage and what the author is talking about.

When:

When was the passage written? (see a Commentary or Dictionary at BlueLetterBible.org) When did the event discussed happen, or when will it happen? When did the people in the story do something?

Where:

Where did the story take place? Where was the author writing from? Where did people go? Where does this passage fit into the overall book as well as the overall story of Scripture. (If you don't know, write that, then ask someone you trust!)

How:

How were things accomplished? How was something to be done? How did the people in the passage respond to events? How should you respond? (you could put this in the Reflection section)

Why:

Why did the author say what he said? Why did the characters do what they did? Why is this passage even present?

Other:

Anything else you actually OBSERVE in the text.

If you are a print book type of person, we would suggest the purchase of Vine's Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words. It is a robust list of many of the English words you will see in the Scriptures. This book will give you the Greek or Hebrew word, the Strongs Concordance number, definitions, and usage information in the text.
