V. 4 - Saints - <u>Vine's</u> : fundamentally signifies "separated" (among

and spiritual significance, separated from sin and therefore

those I have heard about that are faithful, like Paul did with the Colossians.

Epaphras seemed to have more concern for others, namely the Colossians, than they did for
themselves. That is convicting to me and a point of attention.
